Incarnation the Model for Loving Well

Philippians 2:1-11

Phil 2:1-11

Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, then make my joy complete by being **like-minded**, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind. Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.

In your relationships with one another, have the **same mindset as Christ Jesus:**

Who, being in very nature God,
did not consider equality with God something to be used
to his own advantage;

rather, he made himself nothing
by taking the very nature of a servant,
being made in human likeness.

And being found in appearance as a man,
he humbled himself
by becoming obedient to death —
even death on a cross!

Therefore God exalted him to the highest place
and gave him the name that is above every name,
that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow,
in heaven and on earth and under the earth,
and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord,
to the glory of God the Father.

LOVE AS FEELING

LOVE AS TOLERANCE

Definition of exhortation: we are to have the same mind, same love, one in spirit (UNITY). We are to value others above ourselves, not looking at our own interests but rather the interests of others.
